TSA to allow knives, but Michigan ban remains



China to consolidate maritime security agencies under one body

In his final policy address before retiring, China's then leader Hu Jintao said last November that the country should build itself up as a "maritime power". His successor, Xi Jinping, who took over the last of Mr Hu's remaining titles on March 14th, appears eager to make this happen.
