### Eiffel Tower Evacuated in Terror Threat

The 1,063-foot iconic Eiffel Tower of Paris which attracts millions of visitors to Paris each year was evacuated Saturday evening in response to what appeared to be a bomb scare at around 7:00 p.m. local time. Police set up a dragnet around the world-famous Paris monument that is seen in nearly every postcard depicting the French capital, announcing an hours-long search was expected. From now on, military veterans with severe injuries will pass through TSA security checkpoints a little faster. The agency announced the new rules, which state that wounded warriors will be able to go through checkpoints without having to remove shoes, light outerwear jackets or hats. [Read more](#)



### TSA plans to keep using Advanced Imaging Technology (AIT) screening systems at airport checkpoints

TSA has announced that it will be removing Advanced Imaging Technology (AIT) screening equipment at airports that utilize backscatter X-rays, but it does not intend to end its use of AIT screening gear altogether. TSA made clear that it intends to continue using AIT screening equipment as long as the screening systems have been updated with automatic target recognition (ATR) software that effectively obscures the intimate body parts of individuals being screened. ### North Korea declares "state of war" against South Korea while United States plays it down
