TSA To Allow Small Knives On Planes

For the first time since the 9/11 terror attacks, TSA will allow small knives and some previously prohibited sports equipment onto airplanes as carry-on items. Passengers will be able to carry-on knives that are less than 2.36 inches long and less than one-half inch wide. Larger knives, and those with locking blades and molding handles, will continue to be prohibited, as will razor blades and box cutters. [Video Report](#)



Top Democrat Urges TSA to rethink knife policy

Rep. Bennie Thompson (D-Miss.), the ranking member on the committee, objected to TSA's loosening of the rules based on earlier protests made by unions representing flight attendants. "I am very concerned by TSA's decision to modify its prohibited items list and allow knives and other carry-ons that can be used as weapons through airport security," Thompson said in a statement. Lab leads charge in smuggling struggle
