## Malian suicide bomber hits Timbuktu airport

A suicide car-bomber has killed a Malian soldier and wounded six others at the airport in the northern town of Timbuktu overnight, a spokesman for Mali's army said. It was the first suicide attack in Timbuktu since French and Malian forces chased al-Qaida-linked Islamist militants from the ancient trading town nearly two months ago. [Read more](#)



## Seattle airport disrupted by security breach

Passengers at Seattle-Tacoma International Airport were backed up Tuesday night after a security breach was caused when a passenger entered a secure area through an exit. Authorities cleared several concourses until the passenger was located, meaning other passengers in those concourses had to leave the area.
