Man Arrested After 4 Devices Found In Checked Baggage At John Wayne Airport

Authorities said a suspect was in custody after four suspicious devices were found in his checked bag at John Wayne Airport in Santa Ana, prompting the closure of a terminal Tuesday afternoon. The 27-year-old man reportedly boarded Frontier Airlines flight 264 to Denver after checking a bag containing three military artillery fuses and a grenade sting ball that projects rubber pellets, according to Lt. Jeff Hallock of the Orange County sheriff's department. He was arrested on suspicion of possessing a weapon in a prohibited area of the airport. [Video Report](#)
