

Hitachi develops 5-second, explosive-detection system

Hitachi Ltd. said it has developed a system that detects explosive substances on luggage in five seconds, a technology that can improve security and speed up lines at airports and other public facilities. The system combines explosive detection equipment with conventional X-ray machines, enabling inspections of carry-on luggage to be completed while the bags are moving on a conveyor belt, Hitachi said in a statement. Airlines reject call for secondary cockpit security gate

Are flight decks in commercial airplanes vulnerable to hijackers for the few seconds when a pilot opens the cockpit door during flight to stretch, get a meal or use the lavatory? That's the question behind an effort to require airlines to install secondary cockpit barriers, a lightweight gate of steel cables that would be drawn in front of the cockpit door. The gates would create a secure vestibule area while the pilot locks the main cockpit door behind him, foiling potential terrorists with designs on rushing the cockpit in an attempt to wrest control of the plane, supporters say. 
Bomb Threat Forces Plane To Make Emergency Landing In Louisiana

Panama Canal Authority fines detained North Korea ship smuggling Cuban arms

Panama's Canal Authority slapped a fine on Thursday of up to \$1 million on the owners of a North Korean ship seized in July for smuggling Cuban weapons under 10,000 tons of sugar. The fine was for failing to accurately disclose the cargo and putting the canal and canal workers at risk, said Jorge Quijano, head of the semi-autonomous Panama Canal Authority. [Read more](#)



KLIA cops nab Thai woman with cocaine in private parts

A drug mule thought she could get away with hiding a slab of cocaine weighing 500gm in her private parts but she got caught when the way she walked drew the attention of authorities at KL International Airport (KLIA). Police said the woman inserted a 350gm slab of cocaine in her vagina and another five capsules of cocaine weighing 150gm in her rectum. Police described the drug mule from Thailand as an expert since this was not her first attempt. [Read more](#)
