






Jeremy Sawyer of Cicero, N.Y., pleaded not guilty Wednesday to making a bomb or hijack threat. He was released on his own recognizance and ordered to stay away from Logan. Terrorist freed for second time

An al-Qaida plotter jailed for smuggling code books into Britain has been freed for a second time. Habib Ahmed was jailed for ten years in 2008 for his part in a bomb plot terror cell but served less than three. Hong Kong chef busted with 48kg of cocaine in record haul for single passenger
