## Risk of Australians financing terrorism

Australians transfer almost \$600 million a year to countries where terrorism financing is a real risk, a new report shows. The latest report of the independent national security legislation monitor found that Australians were financing terrorism in countries such as Pakistan, Somalia and Syria. ## US Announces Maritime Security Aid for Vietnam, ASEAN Nations

U.S. Secretary of State John Kerry has announced increased maritime security assistance for Vietnam and other nations in the Association of Southeast Asian Nations, or ASEAN. At a press conference in Hanoi Monday with his Vietnamese counterpart, Pham Binh Minh, Kerry said Washington will provide Vietnam with \$18 million, including five fast patrol boats for its Coast Guard. Other ASEAN nations will get about \$14.5 million in assistance to protect their territorial waters. [Read more](#)

## US warship threatened China's security: state media

A US warship that was forced to manoeuvre to avoid a collision with a Chinese naval vessel had "posed a threat", state-run media said Monday, after Washington accused China of being the aggressor. The Global Times newspaper, which often takes a nationalistic stance, said the USS Cowpens guided missile cruiser had "come to China's threshold and posed a threat to China's military security". ## Ministry of Defence security 'asleep on the job' guarding a nuclear bomb factory

Up to 50 MoD police are being probed for allegedly failing to carry out vital security patrols at the 225-acre complex which builds Trident warheads. And last night it was claimed that some were sleeping on the job at the key facility. Seven of the armed officers have resigned and others are facing disciplinary action amid claims they ignored key duties. A source said: "At least some of the police were sleeping on the job when they missed the patrols. "This is highly embarrassing at such a key facility." [Read more](#)



## Police kill 14 'terrorists' in Xinjiang after two officers killed in attack

Police in Xinjiang have killed 14 members of a group described by the Foreign Ministry as terrorists. Two police officers were killed in the incident, which occurred late on Sunday near Kashgar in the western part of the restive autonomous region. A "violent terror gang" attacked police with bombs, Foreign Ministry spokeswoman Hua Chunying said yesterday. An analyst said the clash was evidence of a growing trend of militants operating in small groups in the region, where some of the local Uygur population are engaged in a simmering rebellion against Beijing's rule. ## Sweden fears import of Syrian terrorism

Sweden's security police said they fear that terrorism could be imported by some 75 people who have left Sweden for Syria over the last two years to train or fight with al Qaeda-inspired groups. The Swedish intelligence service Säpo on Monday released several key figures from the past year that testified to an increase in the number of persons commuting between Sweden and the bitter Syrian civil war, where numerous factions are fighting for power. ## Despite plastic gun ban, 3-D printed firearms still have a future

Earlier this year, Cody Wilson, the 25-year-old founder Defense Distributed, a Texas-based group that promotes the use of 3D printed guns, fired a bullet from a plastic gun called the "Liberator." The shot landed at a dusty firing range in central Texas, but was apparently heard in the halls of Congress.
