Travelers leave \$500G in change at airport security checkpoints

In the rush to catch their flights, airline passengers left more than \$500,000 behind at security checkpoints in each of the past two fiscal years, according to data released by the Transportation Security Administration. Under current law, the TSA is allowed to keep unclaimed checkpoint money and spend it on aviation security projects, but one congressional lawmaker is pushing a proposal that would redirect the loose change to members of the military. Rahinah Ibrahim, a Stanford University doctoral student, prepared to board a plane at San Francisco International Airport with her daughter. A Malaysian national, Ibrahim, wearing a traditional Muslim hijab, was headed to an academic conference in Kona. But Ibrahim's routine trip to the airport took a detour that day, sending her on a nearly eight-year odyssey through the American court system -- and transforming an esteemed architectural scholar into a crusader against the U.S. government's secretive system of each year placing thousands of people, mostly foreigners, on "no-fly" lists targeting suspected terrorists. EU lays down data protection steps for Washington

Fish used by drug smugglers re-homed at aquarium

Four large fish used in a drug smuggling operation have been re-homed at a Cheshire aquarium. The freshwater arowanas were used in an attempt to smuggle 17kg of cocaine, with a street value of £1.6m, from Colombia to the UK in 2011. The drugs were hidden in sealed bags containing more than 16,000 tropical fish, most of which died in transit. [Read more](#)
