New ATC tower starts operations

The newly built Air Traffic Control (ATC) tower at Chhatrapati Shivaji International Airport (CSIA) commenced operations with the Airport Authority of India (AAI) taking possession from Wednesday. At 330 ft, the new tower stands 100 ft taller than the old one and offers better surveillance, say officials. At a time, 10 air traffic controllers will work in a shift. Thousands of people caught up in fighting in Central African Republic blocked the runway of its international airport demanding more aid and the resignation of the president. An Air France flight was cancelled on Tuesday and aid and UN flights were also affected, said aid workers. Can Robots Better Spot Terrorists at Airports?

Next to have their jobs automated: airport-security screeners?

Aviation and government authorities are starting to use machines in lieu of people to verify the identities of fliers by scanning their faces, irises or fingerprints. Dozens of airports in Europe, Australia and the U.S. already employ such technology so passengers can pass immigration checks without showing identification to, or talking with, a person. Now, several major airports in Europe have started using these automated ID checks at security checkpoints and boarding gates. The use of biometrics—computers verifying identities through physical characteristics—and other automated techniques in airport security is raising questions about the strengths of man versus machine in detecting potential terrorists.

Hotel in Somali capital Mogadishu hit by car bombs

Two car bombs have exploded outside a hotel in the Somali capital Mogadishu, killing at least 10 people. The blasts were at the Jazeera hotel which is frequented by Somali politicians and foreigners. Reports say the blasts were followed by exchanges of fire between security forces and the attackers.

The Philippine military said an improvised explosive device was used in the attack, which hit the town of Sumisip, on Basilan island. There has been no claim of responsibility and the motive for the attack is not known.

Putin orders security lockdown in Volgograd after second suicide bomb

A second suicide bombing in as many days in the Russian city of Volgograd has killed at least 15 people, injured dozens more and shredded Kremlin claims to have security under control in a region that will host the winter Olympics in less than six weeks. President Vladimir Putin ordered a security clampdown in Volgograd and across the country after the bombing of a crowded trolleybus, which came less than 24 hours after 18 people were killed in a suicide attack at the city's main railway station.

Japan and the United States Renew Commitments to Maritime Security

The U.S. and Japan have taken to strengthening their alliances across Southeast Asia. In the second half of December, Japan and the United States separately made renewed commitments to maintaining maritime security in Southeast Asia. Prime Minister Abe hosted the ASEAN-Japan summit on December 14, and held separate summit meetings with the leaders of nine ASEAN states plus the Thai Deputy Prime Minister from December 12-15.
