IS claims responsibility for deadly Mali attacks on 50 soldiers



The Islamic State on Saturday claimed responsibility for a devastating raid that killed 49 Malian troops as well as a blast that led to the death of a French soldier who became the latest casualty in the conflict-torn region. The strikes underscored the fragility of an area straddling several West African countries battling increasing jihadist violence that has claimed hundreds of lives. Friday's assault on a Malian military outpost at Indelimane in the eastern Menaka region near Niger killed 49 soldiers, wounded three and left 20 survivors, the Malian Armed Forces (FAMA) said Saturday.

IS claims deadly Tajik attack as doubts swirl



The Islamic State group on Friday claimed responsibility for a deadly attack against a Tajik border post this week, but Central Asia watchers cast doubt on the jihadists' claim as well as official Tajik statements on the incident. "By the grace of Allah the Almighty, the soldiers of the Caliphate attacked a border guard post of the Tajik apostates in the Ishkobod area, near the Tajik-Uzbek border," the IS group said in a statement released online. Tajik authorities on Wednesday said that fifteen jihadists were killed during an attack on a border post that officials blamed on members of the Islamic State group who crossed over from Afghanistan. The overnight assault also left a soldier and policeman dead, authorities in the ex-Soviet republic said.

Minister: US State Dept report on Malaysia as source, transit point for terror groups not new



The government today acknowledged the existence of terror groups recruiting and transiting in Malaysia, as noted in the recently published United States Department of State's Country Reports on Terrorism 2018. Home Minister Tan Sri Muhyiddin Yassin, however, asserted that Malaysia will continue to monitor and take preventive measures, including engagement with other countries and security agencies to combat the threat together. "We have known this since several years back that Malaysia is one of the countries designated as a transit point for militant groups as stated in the report. "What is important is what we do here to ensure such elements do not go unnoticed. It is within our knowledge," he said during a press conference here at the ministry's Family Day event. According to the US report, terrorist groups such as Islamic State (IS) and al-Qaeda used Malaysia as a "source and transit point".

Islamists in Office: Salma Yaqoob a Warning for Americans



Last week, a chilling video made the rounds in social media of UK's Labour candidate Salma Yaqoob at an anti-Israel protest in London. The protest, which stood against Israel hosting Eurovision, saw Salma Yaqoob's anti-Semitic "rolodex" scroll through some of history's most notorious Jew-hating tropes [reminiscent of Nazi Germany](#). Her rhetoric this time was absolutely uninged.

Iranian Agents in US Plead Guilty; Saudi Agents Arrested

Two Iranians [pleaded guilty](#) to acting as illegal agents of the Iranian government in the U.S. Ahmadreza Mohammadi-Doostdar, 39, an Iranian with dual U.S. citizenship, and Majid Ghorbani, 60, were caught running surveillance on Jewish facilities and events in the U.S. in support of the Mujahdein-e Khalq (MEK), an exiled Iranian resistance group that advocates for the complete overthrow of Supreme Leader Ali Khamenei and his Islamist regime. According to [an FBI affidavit](#), the two Iranian agents were also preparing “target packages” – i.e., attacks — on individuals who posed threats to the Iranian regime on American soil. Meanwhile, two former employees of Twitter were charged by the Justice Department with acting as illegal foreign agents of Saudi Arabia in the U.S.



Ohio Man Pleads Guilty to Planning Fourth of July Bombing Plot

An Ohio man [pleaded guilty](#) to planning a Fourth of July bombing in Cleveland. Demetrius Pitts, 50, also pleaded guilty to threatening the life of U.S. President Donald Trump and the president’s immediate family. Pitt, who is from Philadelphia, [planned](#) to park a van full of explosives in the downtown area and detonate it during the annual fireworks display. He also wanted to join al-Qaeda. Pitt, who also went by the names Abdul Raheem Rafeeq and Salah ad-Deen Osama Waleed, became radicalized and began expressing anti-American sentiments in 2015. He scouted downtown Cleveland on a reconnaissance mission before the attack, looking for a place to park his van for the Fourth of July bombing. Pitt was on the FBI’s radar. He divulged his plans to an undercover FBI agent whom he believed was an al-Qaeda “brother.”



Militants Kill 54 in Attack on Mali Army Post, ISIS Claims Responsibility

At least 53 soldiers and one civilian have been killed in an attack on an army post in northern Mali, the government said, in one of the deadliest strikes against the West African country’s military in recent memory. Islamic state claimed responsibility for the attack via its Amaq news agency on Saturday, without providing evidence. The militant group has posted dozens of claims of responsibility for attacks in several countries since U.S. special forces killed its previous leader Abu Bakr al-Baghdadi last weekend.
