## How to build a better cyber security defense with deception technologies



Deception technology addresses key challenges with early and accurate detection coupled with automation to accelerate incident response. The solution tricks threat actors into revealing their presence with authentic, high-interaction decoys that blend seamlessly into the production environment. As soon as an attacker attempts to scan the network, steal credentials, or move laterally, the deception platform raises a high-fidelity alert, reducing dwell times. From there, defenders can remediate or safely let the attack play out and collect company-specific threat intelligence to strengthen their defenses.

## US Takes Custody of Notorious ISIS Beheaders



Before turning the guardianship of ISIS prisoners over to Turkey, the U.S. gained custody of some of the most notorious ISIS beheaders suspected of torturing and murdering American and other Western hostages. U.S. officials announced that two of the four members of the British cell responsible for the imprisonment and beheading of American journalist James Foley as well as at least 27 other prisoners, including Americans Steven Scotloff and Peter

Kassig. Foley's murder was choreographed, videoed and broadcast to the world in 2014 in what would become the first of many gruesome propaganda videos put out by the terror group. The cell members in U.S. custody include El Shafee Elsheikh, 31, and Alexandra Kotey, 35. Another famous member of the cell, Mohammed Emwazi, believed to be the executioner on the videos, was killed in a drone strike in 2015.

## "Serial stowaway" arrested at Chicago



Marilyn Hartman was arrested again at O'Hare Airport Friday night and is now facing charges, CBS Chicago reports. The 67-year-old, who's known as a "serial stowaway," was found at the second checkpoint of terminal 1 reportedly attempting to pass through security without a boarding pass or identification. Hartman was taken into custody was charged with one felony count of criminal trespass. Police said Hartman was on probation for a prior trespass incident and is prohibited from going to O'Hare or Midway Airports without a boarding pass.

## Does cyber security cross the line when crossing borders?



Potential visitors to the US were recently confronted with a new requirement on the long and complicated visa application form — to provide information about their social media identities. Many shrugged off the addition, having long assumed that immigration authorities would in any case trawl through publicly available information. The US state department insisted the measures would enhance national security. But academia and civil society groups, expressed alarm. To them, it marked the latest in a series of invasive moves by governments to expand the use of technology to screen travelers, brushing aside privacy and safety concerns.

## Two Killed as Shooter Livestreams German Synagogue Attack on Yom Kippur

A heavily armed assailant tried to force his way into a synagogue Wednesday in eastern Germany on Yom Kippur, Judaism's holiest day, and two people were killed as he fired shots outside the building and into a kebab shop, authorities and witnesses said. The attacker shot at the door of the synagogue in the city of Halle but did not get in as 70 to 80 people inside were observing the holy day, a local Jewish leader said. Video of the attack was livestreamed on streaming site Twitch, which said it had "worked with urgency" to remove it. Germany's top security official, Interior Minister Horst Seehofer, said authorities must assume that it was an anti-Semitic attack, and said prosecutors believe there may be a right-wing extremist motive to it. He said several people were injured.



## Al-Qaeda Bomb Maker Once Dubbed 'World's Most Dangerous Terrorist' Was Killed 2 Years Ago, White House Says

Ibrahim al-Asiri, a senior al-Qaeda bomb maker and terrorist coordinator, was killed two years ago in a United States operation in Yemen, the White House announced on Thursday. Al-Asiri had been in hiding in Yemen for years and was the repeated target of U.S. drone strikes. The U.S. mistakenly believed they had killed him in a 2011 strike. They later targeted a man they believed was al-Asiri in a May 2012 strike, but he turned out to be another al-Qaeda leader. As TIME wrote in 2013, the Obama administration believed al-Asiri was "the most dangerous terrorist in the world."



## Prevention of Terrorism Board to Decide Whether 9/11-Linked Bioweapons Expert Yazid Sufaat Will Be Released

The Malaysian government will wait for the Prevention of Terrorism Board to decide the fate of militant Yazid Sufaat before deciding on the next course of action. It was reported that Yazid, 55, who is directly linked to the Sept 11, 2001, attack on the United States, may be released from detention next month and that the release may raise concerns among anti-terrorism officials in the country. Yazid, a US trained biochemist, has been detained at the Simpang Renggam Prison, near Kluang, for the past two years under POTA where the law allows the suspect to be detained without trial for two years.
