Trump's Ban on Flights to Nine Cuban Cities Goes Into Effect



Travelers who want to visit Cuba will have a difficult time flying to the destination after United States President Donald Trump's [mandate banning airline service](#) to all cities on the island besides Havana took effect Tuesday. According to [CNN.com](#), the Trump administration first announced the ban on commercial airline flights to nine destinations on the island in October following the Cuban government's support of Venezuela's Nicolas Maduro.

Anti-Semitic Attack Leaves 4 Victims Dead in New Jersey



Four people were [killed in New Jersey](#) in an anti-Semitic attack on a kosher market December 10. The same day, President Trump [issued an executive order](#) expanding Title VI of the Civil Rights Act to protect Jewish students on U.S. college campuses who are increasingly facing strident anti-Semitism. The attack in Jersey City began at a cemetery where veteran police detective Joe Seal noticed a U-Haul van parked near a kosher market. Seal, a father of five, realized the van was connected to a recent murder in the area. He was shot

dead by those inside the van, identified at press time only as a man and a woman. Surveillance footage shows the van then proceeded to deliberately drive to the Jewish market, which the driver and passenger entered guns firing. A live pipe bomb was later found in the van.

Pensacola Attack: The Terrorists Didn't 'Just Snap'



[Counter-terrorism analyst Oz Sultan](#) unpacked the events around the December 6 Pensacola terror attack by Mohammed Alshamrani, a Saudi Air Force aviation student who killed three and wounded eight when he open fired with a handgun. Alshamrani was killed by sheriff deputies during the incident at Naval Air Station Pensacola. As the story unfolds, [six](#) other Saudis have been arrested, one of whom filmed the attack as it happened. The attack put Islamist terror back on the radar in the U.S. Among the victims was 19-year-old Airman Mohammed Sameh Haithman, a Muslim, as well as 21-year-old Airman Apprentice Cameron Scott Walter, and 23-year-old Ensign Joshua Kaleb Watson.

College Students Erect Memorial for Jihadi Terrorists



Students at Oberlin College in Ohio [erected](#) a [memorial](#) for jihadi terrorists on school grounds. The terrorists the students were memorializing were members of Palestinian Islamic [Jihad](#) (PIJ), a violent Islamist group and Iranian proxy in the Gaza Strip. Palestinian Islamic Jihad was [designated](#) a foreign terrorist organization by the U.S. in 2001. Other countries, including Canada, Japan and the entire European Union, have also designated the group as a terrorist organization. The PIJ terrorists were killed after the group launched an onslaught against Israeli civilians, shooting 450 rockets and mortars into Israel and injuring 60 over the course of a few days in November.

Hong Kong Airlines given 5 days by government to save company

Hong Kong Airlines, controlled by cash-strapped Chinese conglomerate HNA Group, must shore up its financial position by Dec 7 or risk the suspension or loss of its licence, the Hong Kong government said on Monday (Dec 2). Hong Kong's Transport and Housing Board (THB) said it met with the city's second-largest airline on Nov 27 and expressed "grave dissatisfaction and deep concern" that the carrier's financial position had not improved.



Airbus beats Boeing to become preferred supplier for Qantas Sydney-London flights

Qantas Airways said on Friday (Dec 13) it has chosen Airbus SE as its preferred supplier for jets capable of the world's longest commercial flights from Sydney to London, beating rival Boeing Co after a hard-fought contest. The choice of up to 12 A350-1000 planes fitted with an extra fuel tank for flights of up to 21 hours cements Airbus as the leader in ultra-long haul flying globally at a time when Boeing is battling with delays on its rival 777X program and a broader corporate crisis following two deadly 737 MAX crashes.



Premier League footballer's ex-girlfriend found guilty of funding terrorism with £35 donation

Former beauty contestant and the ex-girlfriend of a professional footballer has been found guilty of funding terrorism. Amaani Noor, 21, was found guilty at Liverpool Crown Court on Thursday of donating 45 dollars, around £35, to organisation The Merciful Hands via Paypal on May 23 last year knowing it would or may be used for the purposes of terrorism. Noor, who the court heard had married an Islamist fighter online and planned to join him in Syria, sobbed in the dock as she was found guilty by a majority of 10 to 2 following three hours and 38 minutes of deliberation. Judge Andrew Menary QC told the five men and seven women on the jury: "It's a sad case."



Reformed prisoner who fought London Bridge attacker was 'prepared to die'

The convicted killer who fought the [London Bridge attacker](#) has spoken how he was "prepared to die" to protect bystanders. Reformed prisoner John Crilly used a fire extinguisher to tackle terrorist [Usman Khan](#), who [killed Cambridge students Jack Merritt and Saskia Jones](#) and wounded three others during a knife attack on 29 November. Mr Crilly fought Khan, who was wearing what he believed to be a live suicide belt. Mr Crilly has been at the Learning Together conference at Fishmongers' Hall when he heard a "very high-pitched girl's scream" after Khan stabbed Miss Jones. He used a wooden lantern and then a fire extinguisher to fight Khan, saying that he was simply acting on "instinct". Two other men used a pole and a whale tusk taken from the venue's wall to fight off Khan and force him out of the building.
