HSAC Outlines Urgent Steps to Secure Faith Community from 'New Age' of Domestic Terrorism



The Homeland Security Advisory Committee is urging stakeholders and policy makers to act quickly to implement a host of new recommendations for better security to protect vulnerable faith-based institutions. The panel found that "houses of worship more frequently build positive relationships with local law enforcement, while mistrust of federal personnel and lack of government outreach often hinder FBO engagement with federal entities." However, there is "still an overall great need for improved connectivity at the local

level." "Securing a congregation is a bottom-up process, and there are no one-size-fits-all security plans," the report notes. "While each place of worship will need to create a system that suits its individual resources, culture, and comfort level, there are concrete steps FBOs can take to enhance security."

ISIS-Aligned Group Executes Four Aid-Worker Hostages in Nigeria



Extremists have executed four Nigerian hostages held since July, the French aid group Action Against Hunger said on Friday. The four were among six hostages held by the extremists, the Paris-based NGO said, adding that one of its staff and two drivers were among those killed. "The armed group responsible for the kidnapping of humanitarian workers on July 18, have murdered four hostages," Action Against Hunger said in a statement that did not identify the victims.

35 Civilians, 80 Terrorists Killed in Double Burkina Faso Attack



A terrorist attack in northern Burkina Faso on Tuesday killed 35 civilians, almost all of them women, the president said, one of the deadliest assaults in nearly five years of terrorist violence in the West African country. Seven soldiers and 80 terrorists were also killed in the double attack on a military base and Arbinda town in Soum province, the army said. Burkina Faso, bordering Mali and Niger, has seen regular terrorist attacks which have left hundreds dead since the start of 2015 when the violence began to spread across the Sahel region.

International Security Operation for Southeast Asian Games Identifies 120 Potential Threats



INTERPOL's deployment of a specialized team to the 30th Southeast Asian Games, which concluded December 11, to support law enforcement authorities in Manila has identified over 120 potential threats and led to the arrest of a number of international fugitives. The INTERPOL Major Events Support Team (IMEST) assisted local authorities as part of the security infrastructure surrounding the event, preparing, coordinating and implementing security arrangements to prevent and address any terrorist threats and serious criminal offences.

TSA Cooperates with South Korea on Aviation Security

As part of the Transportation Security Administration's (TSA) ongoing effort to raise the baseline of global aviation security, TSA recently signed a Joint Statement of Intent with South Korea's Ministry of Land, Infrastructure and Transport (MOLIT) on international aviation security. The agreement was signed under the National Recognition Program, which outlines a framework for bilateral cooperation and further strengthens international aviation security. The agreement was signed with MOLIT Director General Myeongso Eo on Dec. 6 during the eighth annual Aviation Security Cooperation Group (ASCG) meeting in Miami.



NIST Finds Racial, Gender Bias in Facial Recognition Study

How accurately do face recognition software tools identify people of varied sex, age and racial background? According to a new study by the National Institute of Standards and Technology (NIST), the answer depends on the algorithm at the heart of the system, the application that uses it and the data it's fed — but the majority of face recognition algorithms exhibit demographic differentials. A differential means that an algorithm's ability to match two images of the same person varies from one demographic group to another. Results captured in the report, [Face Recognition Vendor Test \(FRVT\) Part 3: Demographic Effects](#) (NISTIR 8280), are intended to inform policymakers and to help software developers better understand the performance of their algorithms. Face recognition technology has inspired public debate in part because of the need to understand the effect of demographics on face recognition algorithms.



Researchers Fooled Chinese Facial Recognition Terminals with a Mask

Facial recognition has been heralded as a secure way to confirm your identity on your phone or at payment terminals, and with features like Face ID on your iPhone, it sometimes seems like the tech really is more secure than other options. But the tech isn't infallible, as public facial recognition terminals can still be fooled with just a mask, as some recent experiments have shown. An AI company, Kneron, shared a video with *The Verge* of tests it ran at facial recognition terminals in China where it appeared to fool the systems. Kneron asked us not to publish the video, so we will describe what we saw — and it looked pretty convincing. In two examples, a tester approaches AliPay and WeChat terminals at shops in China while wearing a 3D mask of his face, and the facial recognition system identifies the mask as his face, allowing the purchase. In another example, the same person feeds his ID card into a train station turnstile while wearing his mask, and the turnstile's facial recognition system accepts the mask as his face.



TSA Expands PreCheck with Qantas and Alitalia

The Transportation Security Administration (TSA) announced December 17 the expansion of its TSA PreCheck expedited screening program with the addition of Alitalia Airlines and Qantas Airways. These two airlines bring the total number of TSA PreCheck participating domestic and international carriers to 73.
