Course Title : BEHAVIOUR ANALYSIS USING ABNORMAL BEHAVIOUR DETECTION TECHNIQUES	
Course Purpose: This course is to meet ICAO Annex 17, RP 4.1.3 which requires Contracting States to consider integrating behaviour detection into its aviation security practices and procedures. It will provide participants with the skills and fundamentals of using Abnormal Behavior Detection Techniques to identify suspicious activities.	
Target Population: The target population will be all security personnel working in the airport and airlines as well as all airport staff, including all enforcement agencies like the Police, Customs, Immigration, Narcotics etc.	
Course Objectives: To enable participants to apply Abnormal Behaviour Techniques to identify and resolve suspicious personnel and activities. Topics that will be covered include: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Defining Abnormal Behavior; • Cite the difference between Abnormal Behavior Detection and People Profiling; • Explain why the Security industry should adopt the Behavior Detection Techniques; • Describe the 6 steps to Abnormal Behavior Detection • List how to conduct environment analysis and establish the baseline; • Demonstrate how to scan people; • Describe the physiological and behavioral suspicious signs; • Demonstrate how to establish contact with individual who has exhibited abnormal behavior; • Practice how to ask questions and the purpose of questioning; • Describe how to confirm or rule out the suspicious signs and what decision to make • Explain micro-expressions and the tell tale-signs when one lies;
