#### Unabomber Ted Kaczynski Dies By Possible Suicide In Prison: Source

Ted Kaczynski, the convicted terrorist known as the Unabomber, died by a possible suicide in his prison cell early Saturday, a source told ABC News. He was 81.A source told ABC News the death is being investigated as a suicide but officially there is no cause of death yet. Kaczynski was found unresponsive in his cell around 12:30 a.m. ET and transported to a local hospital where he was pronounced dead, according to the Federal Bureau of Prisons. Kaczynski was previously in a maximum security facility in Colorado but was moved to a federal medical center in Butner, North Carolina, in December 2021 due to poor health.



Kaczynski, who <u>went nearly 20 years without being captured</u> until his arrest in 1996, was considered America's most prolific bomber.

### New Airport ID Cards For Improved Safety, Security

Safety and security are paramount to Airport Authority Cook Islands (AACI) who have introduced the new identification (ID) card system that will not only strengthen the airport's defences but also enhance operational efficiencies within its organisation. Nancy Matapuku, deputy chairperson of the Airport Authority board, said the cutting-edge technology would ensure a higher level of security clearance for all visitors, workers, and travellers passing through Rarotonga's international airport. The new system incorporates advanced biometrics, printing high-quality laminated IDs, and authorising access to restricted areas, Matapuku said. "A vital step forward in safeguarding our infrastructure, our people, and our country." The first installation of a modern/computerised ID card system was undertaken in 2004. Prior to that, ID cards were manually produced. Matapuku explained the new ID cards have protective layers to protect the card which has a holographic image overlay. "This cannot be altered or tampered with."

#### States agree to heighten aviation safety, security and sustainability through enhanced ICAO support for implementation

Key outcomes of the ICAO Global Implementation Support Symposium (GISS), held in Seoul last week, included Ministerial-level recognition of the fundamental importance of ICAO standards and strategies to the safe, secure, and sustainable development of the global air transport network, in tandem with the pivotal role of ICAO's support towards their implementation. The thirteen States attending the Ministerial Roundtable at the event also pointed to significance of ICAO's efforts to develop and deploy enhanced products and services in this area, and furthermore identified the deployment of sustainable aviation fuel (SAF) as a priority area for support from ICAO.

#### Kolkata: Passengers Offloaded After Man Shouts Bomb In Aircraft

All passengers were brought down from a plane at the NSC Bose International Airport in Kolkata after a man started shouting before take-off that there was a bomb in the aircraft, airport sources said on Tuesday. The Qatar Airways flight to London from here via Doha with 541 passengers on board was getting ready for take-off at 3.29 am on Tuesday when one passenger started shouting that there was a bomb in the plane, the sources said. The airline crew immediately informed the CISF. All the passengers were brought down from the plane and the aircraft was thoroughly searched by police with sniffer dogs but nothing was found, the sources said.

#### Flight Attendant Held For Alleged Cocaine Smuggling At Sangster Airport

A 47-year-old American flight attendant has been arrested for allegedly attempting to smuggle cocaine at the Sangster International Airport in Montego Bay, St James. She is being held for breaches of the Dangerous Drugs Act. The police report that about 12:30 p.m. on Tuesday, the woman was in the process of boarding a flight that was destined for New York when security checks were conducted on her luggage. They say during a search one and a half kilogramme of cocaine was found in her possession. According to the police, the illicit drug has an estimated street value of approximately \$14.5
