Bengaluru-bound Man Detained At Delhi Airport For Carrying 19 Live Cartridges

A man travelling from Delhi to Bengaluru on an Air India flight was caught at Delhi's Indira Gandhi International (IGI) airport after 19 live cartridges were recovered from his possession on Tuesday, officials said. According to Delhi police, the passenger, identified as Ajay Kumar Bana, was set to travel from Delhi to Bengaluru on an Air India flight, was detained on Tuesday at the Delhi Airport in possession of 19 live cartridges. The passenger, according to the Delhi Police, failed to produce any valid documents for carrying such cartridges at the time of boarding, and on the basis of which, he was detained. A case under relevant sections of the Arms Act has been registered at IGI Airport Police Station, the police said. Further probe on the matter is underway.



Chaotic Moment Ryanair Passengers Brawl On Flight In 'Row Over Window Seat'

It was a chaotic moment a fight broke out on a [Ryanair](#) flight during an alleged row over seats on the [plane](#). Neil Modwhadia, who was on the flight from Malta to London Stansted on July 3, claimed the brawl began after one of the two male passengers refused to let the other pass. In the clip filmed by the passenger, someone can be heard telling the two men to stop fighting and saying in the background: "We're never gonna get home." Screams by fellow passengers can be heard in the footage while someone encourages the men to "calm down". A Ryanair staff member appears to be walking down the cabin in a bid to separate the pair.

Saudi Arabia: Three Passengers Arrested For Concealing 3kg Of Drugs In Their Guts

Officials at King Abdulaziz International Airport in Jeddah have successfully foiled an attempt to smuggle more than 3 kilogrammes of cocaine into Saudi Arabia. The illicit drug was ingeniously concealed in the intestines of three passengers who arrived at the airport. During the routine inspection of incoming passengers, officials became suspicious of the trio and subjected them to X-rays. The scan subsequently revealed the concealed cocaine in their digestive systems. The authority pointed out that this smuggling method, involving the concealment of narcotics inside the body, is one of the significant tactics employed by smugglers to import drugs such as cocaine and heroin into the country.



Edinburgh Airport Orders 3D Scanners That Will End Liquids Rule

Edinburgh Airport has ordered new high-tech scanners that will bring an end to some security rules over hand luggage next year. The move comes ahead of a government deadline of June 2024 for most UK airports to install 3D scanners. It means passengers will not have to remove liquids and electronic devices from hand luggage for security checks. Eight scanners made by Smiths Detection are expected to be phased in at Edinburgh during the course of 2024. The equipment produces 3D X-ray images and is similar to CT scanners used in hospitals. It enables staff to zoom in on a bag's contents and rotate the images for inspection.



Nine Israelis Arrested Upon Landing In Turkey For Sexual Harassment Of Attendant

Nine Israelis were arrested last Thursday after landing in Istanbul after a flight attendant from the plane they arrived on from Israel complained that she had been [sexually harassed](#). Among the detainees were two young men from [Sderot](#) and seven from Rahat and the Bedouin diaspora. The Israelis claim that the flight attendant was harassing them. "On the plane, we felt that she didn't like Israelis," said Eli, who was one of the people accused. "Then my cousin took a video of her giving the safety instructions before takeoff. She approached him and he deleted the video from the phone.



A Man Described As 'Extremely Drunk' By Fellow Passengers Tried To Open A Plane's Door Mid-flight

A flight from Turkey to Scotland was forced into an emergency landing on Sunday night. Passengers told MailOnline an "extremely drunk" passenger tried to open the plane's exit in mid-air. The man was arrested by police in Bulgaria before the plane continued to Glasgow with a two-hour delay. A Jet2 flight from Turkey to Scotland was forced into an emergency landing on Sunday after a passenger tried to open the exit mid-journey, [MailOnline](#) reported. The Boeing 737 was one hour into the five-hour journey from the tourist hotspot of Bodrum, Turkey when it was diverted to Sofia, Bulgaria, per [Flightradar24](#). One traveler told the outlet the man was "extremely drunk" and "looked like he'd maybe woken up and didn't know where he was or anything."
