There have been bomb threats at 18 locations in Singapore, including government buildings and embassies. - The police have been investigating the threats and have not found any explosive devices. - The threats were received via email, and the police are working to identify the sender. - Security measures have been stepped up at the affected locations. - The police have urged the public to remain vigilant and report any suspicious activities



More than 3.3 tonnes of 'harmful drugs' found at Toronto Pearson airport in 2 months

More than 3.3 tonnes of illicit substances were found at Toronto Pearson International Airport over a two-month period this summer, border officials say. In a <u>news release issued Thursday</u>, the Canadian Border Services Agency (CBSA) said the substances—identified as PMK ethyl glycidate and 1,4-butanediol—were found in multiple separate shipments arriving from Asia. They were intercepted by border services officers between June and July of this year.



Zambian arrested at Bengaluru airport with 1 kg of cocaine worth ₹15 crore

Officials of the Directorate of Revenue Intelligence (DRI) nabbed a 40-yearold Zambian national at the Kempegowda International Airport (KIA) and recovered 1 kg of cocaine worth ₹15 crore from him on Wednesday.The accused was carrying the drugs concealed in a children's book, which he was holding, and waiting for luggage clearance. While analysing the profiles of the passengers, the officials on a suspicion zeroed in on the accused and kept a close watch on him. The officials noticed the accused was carrying the nursery rhymes book with him and took him into custody.

Ex-head of security at Geneva Airport convicted of corruption

The Criminal Court in Geneva sentenced the former head of security at Geneva airport to three years in prison for passive bribery, six months of which were unconditional on Friday. The man had favoured a company in exchange for money so that it received orders from the airport. The former executive, who admitted to the offences, appeared in court under a simplified procedure. He was found guilty of passive bribery, unfaithful business management, breach of official secrecy, incitement to forgery of documents and aiding and abetting unemployment insurance fraud.



easyJet Passenger Arrested at London Gatwick Airport

The 28-year-old individual from Spalding, who was taken into custody on suspicion of various offenses, including assault resulting in actual bodily harm, has been issued a civil protection order aimed at safeguarding the victim. The passenger who was apprehended and placed under <u>arrest</u> by Cambridgeshire police upon disembarking a plane at <u>Gatwick Airport</u> (<u>LGW</u>) has been subsequently released without any charges being filed.According to a police spokesperson, "Following the interrogation, the Crown Prosecution Service declined to authorize any charges.



New Airline: Indian Businessman in the UAE to Launch Air Kerala

Air Kerala, which sought to give Keralites living in the nation relief from exorbitant ticket costs and a dearth of available seats, has been put on hold numerous times. A businessman in Dubai is reviving an airline for expats from the southern Indian state of Kerala. Afi Ahmed, the founder of Smart Travels, stated he is looking at various options for realizing the idea of <u>Air Kerala</u>. The businessman shelled out a hefty Dh1 million last month to acquire the domain name airkerala.com from another local firm.

Asia's Largest Airport Runway will be ready by the end of 2023

Uttar Pradesh's Chief Minister, Yogi Adityanath, announced on August 10, 2023, that the initial runway of the <u>Noida International Airport (NIA)</u>, currently under construction in Jewar, is anticipated to be completed by the end of this year. The NIA, a flagship project of the BJP, is slated to become the world's fourth-largest and the largest in <u>Asia</u> upon its completion.
