Security Breach At Old Seawell Airport

Several bags of marijuana were among items stolen from a bond at the old Seawell Airport next to the Grantley Adams International Airport (GAIA) in a sophisticated crime which is being called "a national security breach". DAILY NATION investigations reveal that over the weekend, between Sunday and Monday, culprits cut through the perimeter fence on the compound in order to gain access to an area where bonds are located. They then broke the lock at the rear of one of the bonds and made off with several items including the illegal drugs as well as several fire sticks and other items. These were items which were confiscated by the Customs Department over the years.



Three From Kadapa Caught Smuggling Gold At RGI Airport

The Cyberabad Special Operations Team caught three persons from Kadapa who smuggled gold into the country through [RGI Airport](#), Shamshabad on Monday and seized 621 grams of the yellow metal from them. The trio Shaik Chand Basha (50), Shaik Abubgari Sadiq (25) and Mohammed Munna Basha (29), all three natives of Proddutur, Kadapa were carrying the gold in the car parking area of the airport when they were caught, said DCP Special Operations Team, Mohd Abdul Rasheed. The trio arrived in the city from [Saudi Arabia](#) and managed to bring out the gold after hoodwinking the customs officials.



Militants Attack Military Base Adjacent To Gao Airport Sept. 8

Al-Qaeda-linked Jama'at Nasr al-Islam wal Muslimin (JNIM) has claimed responsibility for an attack against a military base adjacent to Gao Airport (GAQ) early Sept. 8. Security officials confirmed the attack. While details are still emerging, reports indicate that the assault involved suicide bomb attacks and mortar shells. The casualty toll and potential damages to GAQ are unclear. This is the third attack occurring between Timbuktu and Gao since Sept. 7, when two attacks attributed to the JNIM killed at least 64 people along the Niger River. Further such attacks are likely in the near term.



Suicide Attack Near Airport In Northwest Pakistan; No Casualties Reported

A suicide bomber blew himself up near a vehicle of Pakistan's security forces close to a nonfunctional airport in the country's restive Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province on Thursday but did not cause any casualties, an official said. The explosives wrapped up around the bomber's body exploded with a big bang near the Bannu Airport, bordering north Waziristan. The airport has been nonfunctional for the last couple of years.



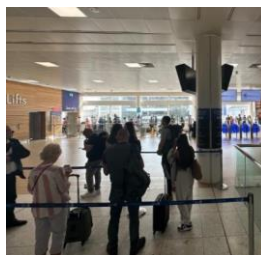
PAL Warns Against Scams On Cargo Shipments

Philippine Airlines (PAL) warned the public against scams on domestic cargo shipments and unauthorized use of its name. PAL said a recent example of this was when scammers sent messages on Facebook/Messenger tricking individuals into making payments for shipments supposedly loaded on a PAL flight, the carrier said in an [advisory](#) on September 4. The messages may even come with fake PAL cargo airway bills as "proof" of such shipments, the airline added. PAL said the supposed transactions are "totally bogus" and that no such cargo shipments exist, with the online payments only going to fraudsters.



Glasgow Airport National Security Incident - What We Know So Far

A passenger told the Glasgow Times that 'police stations' were set up before duty-free at security. He advised that every passenger was getting their passport manually checked before they were allowed through. This is the section of the airport where you normally scan your boarding pass before placing your items on a conveyor belt to be checked by scanners. At this section, you also walk through a detector and can be searched. The Glasgow Times understands this is where the delay is. Passengers are being told that UK Border Forces are dealing with a national incident. The passenger who spoke to The Glasgow Times said he believed that police were looking for someone. An official source has not commented on this.



Kenyan Mules Caught 'Stomach Smuggling' Cocaine Into Phuket

On September 7, Sa Koo district police in Phuket province announced the arrest of three Kenyan women at Phuket International Airport in Mai Khao subdistrict, Thalang district, Phuket. They were suspected of sneaking cocaine into the country by eating it. It took the cops up to two days to get it out of their bodies. The investigation began on September 3, 2023, when Sa Koo police received information from the Narcotics Suppression Bureau smth that there was a significant influx of foreigners involved in cocaine trafficking. They teamed up with the Airport Interdiction Task Force (AITF) to stop the drug trade. No illegal substances were found when the group of foreigners were checked, so they were taken to a hospital in Thalang District for x-rays, where a large number of suspicious items were found in their bellies.



Airline Passenger Arrested After Threatening He Planted A Bomb Under The Plane

An airline passenger is now behind bars after threatening he put a bomb under the plane to a fellow passenger as they were getting ready to disembark the plane. Kenneth Lee Szogas, 62, returned to Palm Beach International Airport on Avelo Airlines from New Haven, Connecticut, last Thursday when he made the threat to another person that he placed a bomb under the aircraft they had just arrived on. That passenger reported the threat made by Szogas to the Avelo gate agent, Dayshawn Stevenson, immediately after he exited the loading jetway. Once Szogas walked out behind the passenger, he admitted to the gate agent that he, in fact, did make that threat.
