## Security check!

A walk-through security scanner that it is claimed can cut airport passenger queues is seeking to raise investment. A series of demonstrations for investors in August is showing how the Sequestim scanner uses space technology to detect hidden objects. By detecting heat from the human body, which acts as a light bulb, it is said to be able to easily detect and identify concealed items, even through heavy clothing. Originally developed by researchers at Cardiff University to study the most distant objects in the Universe, the scanner films people as they walk by. Unlike the body scanners now in use at airports, no radiation is shone at the passenger, and nobody sees the images, which in any case do not show intimate physical details.



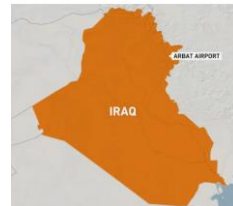
## Gold Bar Worth Rs 12.50 Lakh Concealed In Slippers Seized At Trichy Airport

Customs officials at Trichy Airport in Tamil Nadu on Monday said that they confiscated 209 grams of 24K purity gold valued at Rs 12.50 lakhs from a passenger who had concealed it in slippers. The passenger was detained based on profiling after arriving at Trichy Airport from Singapore on September 10. "The gold bar was ingeniously concealed within a paste-like material hidden inside the slippers. The recovered gold was confiscated under the provisions of Section 110 of the Customs Act, and the passenger was subsequently arrested under Section 104 of the Customs Act," the official said. He said that the accused was presented before a local court, which remanded him to fourteen days of judicial custody.



## Airport In Iraq's Kurdish Region Hit By Deadly Drone Attack

At least three people have been killed in a suspected drone attack on an airport near the city of Sulaymaniyah in the semi-autonomous Kurdish region in northern Iraq, official sources have told Al Jazeera. Al Jazeera's Mahmoud Abdelwahed, reporting from the Iraqi capital Baghdad, said that the Arbat airport, located 50km (30 miles) to the east of Sulaimaniya, has been used by the "anti-terrorism" combat apparatus that is part of Sulaymaniyah security forces.



## Nineteen Philippine Airport Security Screening Officers Fired For Stealing

A total of 19 personnel of the Office for Transportation Security (OTS), an attached agency of the Department of Transportation (DOTr), have been fired since July 2022 after they were caught stealing from airline passengers, according to Transportation Secretary Jaime Bautista.



## Two Held For Illegal Visa Trading

The Search and Follow-up Department has detained two persons of Arab and Asian descent respectively for their involvement in illegal visa trading, the Ministry of Interior (MoI) said Thursday. The two were operating through multiple sham companies for financial gains, a post on X by the MoI added. Both suspects now face legal actions and have been handed over to the Public Prosecution, the statement said.



## Drunk AirAsia Passenger Arrested After Misbehaving With Crew In Bengaluru

A 40-year-old passenger on a Goa-bound AirAsia flight was arrested at Bengaluru airport for harassing a flight attendant. According to police, the incident took place on September 13, minutes before the flight took off for Goa. The police said that the passenger named Anil Kumar, aged 40 allegedly misbehaved with the flight attendant by holding her hand and claiming to others that she was his close friend. While the other passengers laughed, the attendant was left outraged and embarrassed. The airline crew escorted Mr Kumar out of the aircraft and handed him over to the police.



## Man In Court Over Knife Attack At Dublin Airport

A 51-year-old man charged with stabbing a tourist at Dublin Airport last week has been refused bail and held in custody. Kasonga Mbuyi, with an address at a hostel on Clare Street in Co Limerick, was charged with assault causing harm, unlawful possession of a penknife as a weapon and with carrying an article with intent to cause injury. The incident occurred outside the Departures Lounge at Terminal 1 last Sunday. At Dublin District Court today, Judge John Campbell refused Mr Mbuyi bail and held him in custody until he appears at Cloverhill District Court on Wednesday. Detective Garda Cathal Connolly told the court that Mr Mbuyi made no reply to the assault charge, but responded "I was looking for help" to the weapons offences. The court heard that the German national suffered eight wounds to his left arm and body, requiring 12 stitches. He has since been discharged from hospital.



## American Tourist Arrested After Attack On Security Guards

An American tourist has been arrested for allegedly attacking security guards blocking him from entering an airport in the Philippines. Tyrone Bennett rode a cab from a condominium in the Makati district of the capital Manila to catch a flight at the Ninoy Aquino International Airport (NAIA) on September 14. However, airport security barred him from entering Terminal 3 as he could not produce a ticket, sending him into a rampage. He was seen grabbing APO1 John Carlo Carbonel in a headlock, then jabbing at him as other employees called police for help. Officers later arrived and cuffed Tyrone. Despite being pinned to the ground, he was heard threatening a cop, saying: 'I know your face. You're gonna get it.' Airport police chief Froilan Sanchez said: 'The man had hailed a taxi from Makati City.'
