Saudi Arabia Condemns Terror Attack In Niger That Left 29 Soldiers Dead

Saudi Arabia has condemned a terrorist attack in Niger on Monday that targeted soldiers deployed close to the nation's border with Mali, the Saudi Press Agency reported on Wednesday. At least 29 Nigerien soldiers were killed and many more were seriously injured. More than 100 extremists used homemade explosives in the assault on security forces who were carrying out a clearance operation in the border region of the West African nation, Niger's defense minister, Lt. Gen. Salifou Mody, said on Monday. It was the second such attack on Nigerien soldiers in the space of a week.

Dutch Traveler Arrested For Hiding 784 Grams Of Cocaine Inside Body

Police were alerted to the airport on Sunday after a man was found smuggling cocaine inside his body. A Dutch man who arrived from France on September 24 (Sun) felt unwell and was found by the airport staff, who contacted the police for assistance. He was taken to the North Lantau Hospital for medical attention, where he was found to be carrying drugs inside his body. By today, he had already excreted 57 bags of suspected cocaine, weighing up to 784 grams.



Helsinki Airport Security Checks Disrupted Due To JHL Walkout Protest

Travelers passing through Helsinki Airport on Thursday, October 5, should brace for potential delays as the Trade Union for the Public and Welfare Sectors (JHL) plans a walkout from 1:30 to 2:00 pm. The demonstration, aimed at opposing what the union deems "unreasonable misery" imposed on the workforce by the government's policies, is expected to impact security checks for half an hour.

How The Aviation Industry Plans To Tackle Unruly Passengers

Stories and videos of unruly passengers have unfortunately been on the rise in the last few years, putting the safety of passengers and crew at risk. At the <u>IATA World Security and Operations Conference</u> (WSOC) earlier this month, industry leaders laid out their plan of action to tackle the problem. ICAO is welcoming more states to its Montreal Protocol 2014 (MP14), which grants jurisdiction to deal with unruly passengers regardless of nationality or flight origin - without this, it is difficult to enforce action against offending passengers, leading to them escaping any punishment. IATA has voiced its support for the protocol, which now has around 45 signatories. This represents just 33% of international passenger traffic, something the industry is eager to expand upon.



Bomb Threat: Akasa Air Plane Makes Emergency Landing At Varanasi Airport

An Akasa aircraft from Mumbai with 166 people onboard made an emergency landing at Varanasi airport on Friday after the airline received a bomb threat message on social media, according to an airline spokesperson. The airline said the captain of the flight QP 1498 received an "emergency alert" from the Varanasi Air Traffic Controller and followed all required emergency procedures and landed the plane safely at Varanasi.



Man Strips Naked In Ben-gurion Airport And Attacks Passengers

Ben-Gurion Airport security guards on Wednesday detained a man on suspicion of <u>assaulting</u> two people while completely naked on the airport's premises, according to Israeli media. An airport employee present at the scene said: "We received a report of a man walking around naked and knocking on tables. When we arrived at the scene we saw that he was completely naked." "This is the first time we have come across such a case."



Air Mauritius CEO And CFO Suspended

Air Mauritius's Board of Directors announced last week that CEO, **Krešimir Kučko**, and CFO, **Jean Laval Al Chip**, had been suspended pending an internal investigation regarding the executives accepting a supplier-sponsored stay in a hotel in France. According to *airspace-africa.com*, an investigation is ongoing into the circumstances surrounding a trip the CEO and CFO took to France, during which Air Mauritius aircraft-supplier, Aercap, paid for all their travel expenses. The enquiry is investigating the occurrence as a possible violation of the principles of corporate governance.



Rs300m Crystal Meth Haul Disguised As Dry Fruits Seized At Karachi Airport

In a significant operation at Karachi's Jinnah International Airport, the Pakistan Customs Drug Enforcement Cell on Saturday uncovered a stash of crystal methamphetamine, commonly known as "crystal ice", with an estimated street value of Rs300 million. The narcotics were concealed within three baskets of dry fruits that were originally sent from Afghanistan to Bahrain and subsequently returned to Pakistan.
