AFP Arrests Masood Zakaria at Darwin Airport

Alleged <u>Sydney</u> gangland figure Masood Zakaria has been charged with a string of <u>offences</u>, including conspiracy to <u>murder</u>, after arriving in Sydney following his deportation from <u>Turkey</u>. The 28-year-old was arrested at Darwin Airport on Sunday after he was deported by Turkish authorities and extradited on Monday to Sydney, where he arrived yesterday afternoon. Late last night, NSW Police announced Zakaria - who'd been wanted on an arrest warrant for a number of serious offences - had been taken to Surry Hills police station and charged. He is due to appear in court today.



RCMP Officer Charged With Assault After Investigation Into Stephenville Airport Incident

An RCMP officer has been charged with assault following an investigation into an incident at Stephenville Dymond International Airport in June. Newfoundland and Labrador's Serious Incident Response Team (SIRT-NL) received notification of "an alleged offence from the RCMP" and launched an investigation <u>after a video surfaced</u> at the time showing police officers pushing a man into the side of a police vehicle. The passenger was aboard a Delta Airlines flight from Paris to Detroit when it had to make an emergency landing for what the airline called an "unruly passenger." In a news release on Tuesday, SIRT-NL director Michael King wrote the officer charged with assault is Const. Jeffrey Cormier. Cormier is scheduled to appear in court on Jan. 22.



Unruly Passenger Compels Bangkok-Bound Lufthansa Flight To Divert To Delhi

A Lufthansa flight (LH772) from Munich to Bangkok was diverted to Delhi on Wednesday due to an unruly passenger on board, reported ANI quoting sources at Delhi airport as saying. "A Lufthansa flight (LH772) from Munich to Bangkok has been diverted to Delhi due to an unruly passenger on board. Security personnel have reached and are waiting for flight gates to be opened," the report stated, quoting sources as saying. Last week on November 23, an IndiGo flight for Jeddah to Hyderabad was diverted to Karachi in Pakistan following a medical emergency on-board. In a statement, the airline said that the captain diverted the flight to Karachi, where the passenger was attended to by a doctor on arrival.

Joint Operation at Air And Land Borders Seizes Forged Documents, Firearms And Narcotics

Between November 13 and 18, law enforcement authorities joined forces at land and air borders across Southeast and Eastern Europe to target firearms trafficking, drug trafficking, migrant smuggling and trafficking in human beings, as well as high-risk criminal networks. In total, more than 22,000 officers from 26 countries across Europe, supported by Frontex, Europol, Eurojust, Interpol and other international organizations, took part. Spain coordinated the operational activities. In total, the operation foiled 2,229 illegal border entry attempts and seized 114 forged documents. In its risk analysis report for 2023, Frontex said passports have become the most reported fraudulent document type, with an increase of 35% in 2022 from 2021. Airports in the Arabian Peninsula were identified as major hubs for threats connected with irregular migration based on the use of fraudulent documents. At the time of its risk analysis, Frontex predicted that this trend would be maintained or even increase throughout 2023.

Airline Security Officer Among 2 Held With Drugs At Tripura Airport

Agartala, Nov 27 (PTI) Two persons including a security executive of an airline were arrested on the charge of trying to smuggle 40 kg of ganja valued at Rs 2 lakh in a flight from Agartala to Kolkata on Monday, a police officer said. Acting on a tip-off, a police team reached the Maharaja Bir Bikram Airport in the Tripura capital and caught the two at the security checkpoint. While one of them was carrying the contraband, the other one who is a security executive of an airline, was helping him smuggle the ganja in a flight, Sub Divisional Police Officer of New Capital Complex, Parmita Pandey, said. She said the police suspect more people are likely to be involved in ganja smuggling via flights.

US Allocated Over \$20 Million For Aviation Security In Libya Since 2018

The United States has allocated over \$20 million to enhance aviation security in Libya since 2018, the Charge d'Affairs at the US Embassy in Libya, Jeremy Brent revealed on his X platform on Tuesday. Brent made his remarks at a US-sponsored training course that was organized for airport officials in Libya. "An inspiring group of airport officials from across Libya at the U.S.-sponsored aviation security training that I attended today." He added. He said the objective of the initiative is to help connect Libya to the world through commercial air travel and build the capacity of more than 3,000 airport officials, noting that the training course saw the participation of over 300 women.



Australian Passenger Pulled Off Flight After Fighting Other Flyer On Plane

An Australian man was pulled off a plane in the Philippines by police after he slapped a passenger, which sparked a dramatic fight down the aisle. As officers took him away he appeared to challenge another flyer for a "one-on-one" on the tarmac. The man, who began his journey in Perth, Australia, allegedly insulted other passengers and "demanded drinks" from the flight crew. Shocking video recorded by flyers on the Scoot flight caught the fracas and the ensuing screams from other travelers.
