Judge in Trump Case Threatened With Bomb

A bomb threat was reported at the home of Judge Arthur Engoron, who is presiding over Donald Trump's civil fraud case, on Long Island just hours before closing arguments in the trial. The Nassau County bomb squad is investigating the threat; it remains unclear if Judge Engoron was at home during the incident. Tensions escalated between Judge Engoron and Trump's attorney over the former president's request to speak during closing arguments. The threat caused delays in courthouse security, and protesters gathered outside during the trial proceedings.

A man returning from the Philippines has been arrested at Sydney airport after police allegedly uncovered evidence of overseas child grooming. The 59-year-old, from Lurnea in Sydney's southwest, was stopped for a baggage examination on Friday, according to the Australian Federal Police (AFP). Australian Border Force officers allegedly found child abuse material and conversations discussing child abuse on his phone, leading police to detain the man at the airport. 'AFP officers interviewed the man and he allegedly admitted to engaging in the conversations,' an AFP spokesman said. Police will allege he groomed someone overseas in an attempt to sexually abuse a child.





CBSA Intercepts 29 kg of Suspected Cocaine in High-Stakes Airport Bust



In a major victory against drug trafficking, the Canada Border Services Agency (CBSA) announced the successful seizure of 29 kg of suspected cocaine from a commercial aircraft arriving in Canada. The interception occurred on November 30, 2023, at Toronto Pearson International Airport, where vigilant border services officers collaborated with the Greater Toronto Area (GTA) Region Specialized Border Interdiction Unit. The CBSA, dedicated to disrupting the inflow of illicit drugs into the country and safeguarding communities, has been relentless in its pursuit of curbing drug-related crimes. The recent operation underscores the agency's commitment to these objectives.

New Self-Screening System for Air Travel Unveiled



In a groundbreaking move towards enhancing airport efficiency, the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) is piloting a revolutionary self-screening system, akin to a supermarket self-checkout, at Harry Reid International Airport. This experimental initiative, known as the Screening at Speed (SaS) program, is poised to transform the air travel experience, promising more convenience and shorter wait times for passengers. The SaS program, managed by the Transportation Security Administration (TSA), seeks to empower passengers by allowing them to take control of their security screenings. Dr. John Fortune, the program manager, elaborated on the technology's development, stating, "We are developing technology that would enable the scanning of walking passengers, acquiring data through most garments and reliably detecting a wider range of prohibited items regardless of concealment."

FAAN Intensifies Airport Security, Arrests Five for Touting and Vandalism

In a concerted effort to maintain security and order, the Federal Airports Authority of Nigeria (FAAN) has launched a crackdown on touting and vandalism at Nigerian airports. This decisive action was sparked by the apprehension of five individuals suspected of such activities at the Murtala Muhammed International Airport. The Joint Monitoring Task Force (JMTF) spearheaded the operation that led to these arrests. The suspects were found near the Joint Users Hydrant Installation (JUHI) Canal and the International Access Road Bridge. Further, during the operation, several shanties that had been erected by miscreants and were suspected to serve as potential hideouts for criminals were dismantled.





Australian Government Gifts OTS Additional X-Ray Tutor to Enhance Aviation Security Training Capability



As part of its continuing support to the Philippine government, particularly to airport authorities, the Australian Government gifted the Office for Transportation Security (OTS) an additional dedicated laptop installed with a computer-based x-ray image interpretation software on January 10, to enhance OTS personnel's competency in detecting prohibited items at the airport. This software is primarily designed to enhance the capability in detecting guns, weapons, and improvised explosive devices as well as its components. The dedicated laptop was turned over by Australian Ambassador to the Philippines, Her Excellency HK Yu PSM to OTS Officer-in-Charge Assistant Secretary Jose A. Briones Jr. Asec.
