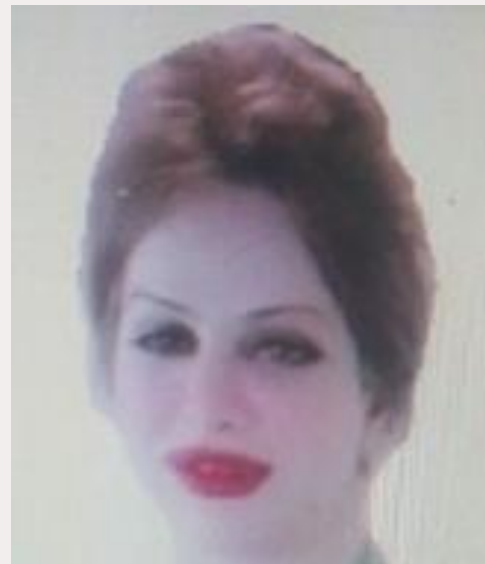

PIA Air Hostess Held in Canada

A Pakistan International Airlines (PIA) female flight attendant -- assigned on a Canada-bound flight -- was detained at the Toronto airport after multiple passports were found in her possession. Hina Sani, who landed in Toronto on PIA flight PK-789, was held after Canadian immigration authorities found several passports belonging to different individuals in her luggage. Travelling with passports other than your own is an international crime. According to sources, Sani was previously warned for bringing prohibited items to Canada.





Joint Operation Leads to Cocaine Seizure in Bahamas

U.S. Coast Guard Air Station Borinquen aircrews assisted the Royal Bahamas Police Force and the U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration with the transfer and disposition of approximately 391 kilos of cocaine worth an estimated value of \$7.5 million, Tuesday, at the Mayaguana Airport in The Bahamas. Operation Bahamas Turks and Caicos partners collaborated to interdict the contraband. The Royal Bahamas Police Force Drug Enforcement Unit coordinated with Mayaguana Airport Police and DEA agents to seize a suspected smuggling aircraft and discovered the contraband. The RBPF took custody of a suspected smuggler and the RBPF public affairs and communication department reported that the case investigation is ongoing.

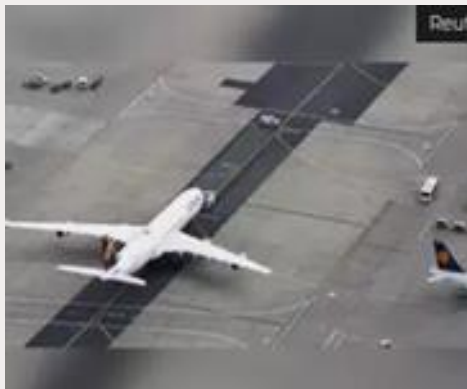

Jakarta Police Capture Portuguese Nationals Involved in Liquid Cocaine Trafficking Operation



The Jakarta Police have uncovered an international cocaine trafficking case involving 2,598 milliliters of liquid cocaine. Five individuals have been arrested in connection with the case. Director of Narcotics Hengki said that two out of the five suspects are foreign nationals from Portugal, identified as RPAV and FMGS. "RPAV acted as the courier while FMGS acted as the recipient," Hengki said during a press conference at the Metro Jaya Regional Police headquarters in Jakarta on Monday. Hengki revealed that the liquid cocaine was transported from Portugal and concealed in bottles of various shampoo brands, a tactic employed to deceive airport authorities.

A twelve-year-old boy has been identified for making false bomb threats targeting Belgrade Nikola Tesla Airport and several schools in the Serbian capital. The child was behind the events which saw the airport temporarily close on February 29 after he made a threat against an Air Montenegro flight, as well as a Wizz Air flight headed to Barcelona, which was on its final departure run and was forced to evacuate on the taxiway, deploying emergency slides as stairs were unable to reach the jet. He continued with threats against another two flights on March 1. As the boy is under fourteen years old and cannot face prosecution under Serbian law, his parents will face criminal charges under the suspicion that they have committed the offense of neglecting or abusing a minor. The boy also sent the threats, via email, to four primary schools and the Ministry for Education, Science and Technological Development.





'Scandalous' Airport Inspection Reveals Lack of Private Jet Security Checks



A watchdog warned of a “significant risk to security” at a busy London airport and raised concerns private jets were landing in the UK without undergoing proper security checks, according to a report. The newly published review was written by former independent chief inspector of borders and immigration David Neal, who was sacked last month by the Home Office after publicly sharing his fears about the problem. Mr Neal “breached” the terms of his appointment, according to the Government department, which also said it disputes the report claiming it is based on inaccurate data. Shadow home secretary Yvette Cooper said the report is “scandalous” and exposes a “Conservative Government which has lost control of our borders and our border security”.
